Membership Entrance Criteria

Full Membership is currently conferred on:

- Ayurvedic practitioners with a BAMS or equivalent Central Council for Indian Medicine (CCIM) and/or Sri Lanka Ayurveda Medical Council (SLAMC) approved degree. They must be proficient in English language
- practitioners who hold a BA (Hons.) degree in Ayurvedic Studies from TVU, a College of Ayurveda diploma (3 years) or an equivalent degree. In addition

they must also have completed a minimum of 500 hours of supervised clinical training in an APA approved college or university hospital, or have already been practising Ayurvedic medicine for a minimum of 3 years

- practitioners who hold a PG Diploma or a Masters degree in Ayurveda from Middlesex University.

Therapist Membership is currently conferred on:

- Ayurvedic practitioners from abroad who are in the UK with a student visa, or equivalent short-term visa that is without work permit or with a work permit that only allows a limited number of hours of work per week
- Anyone resident in the UK who fulfills the APA Therapist entrance criteria available to download from the APA website.

Student Membership is currently conferred on:

- undergraduate students of UK validated Ayurveda degree/diploma courses

If you retain your membership, but stop practising for more than 3 years without having evidence of continuing professional development during this time, your eligibility for membership will be re-assessed.

Annual Membership Fees

The APA membership year begins in January. Fees are based on the above membership categories as follows:

Full member: £120. Payment can either be made in full by bank transfer or online via a secure link, which can be emailed to you. Full members joining for the first time later in the year pay a reduced fee in a sliding scale. Please contact the office for further details.

Therapist member: £85 (payment in full by bank transfer or online as above)

Student member: £35 (payment in full by bank transfer or online as above)

Friends member: £35 (payment in full by bank transfer or online as above)
